About this Guide



This guide was created to help mobilize Africans across the globe for African Liberation Week (May 19-25) and in particular, African Liberation Day which is recognized every year on May 25. African Liberation Week is the largest annual mobilization of Africans Rising for Unity Justice, Peace and Dignity.

Africans Rising is excited to co-create activities and events across the continent and the diaspora through this day of collective action. While African Liberation Day takes place on May 25, any event that happens in the spirit of Pan-African unity throughout the month of May is a welcome addition to our global mobilization. This guide outlines some of the ways both big and small that anyone can join us - and we hope you will!

About Africans Rising

Africans Rising for Unity, Justice, Peace and Dignity is a global Pan-African movement of people and organizations, working for unity, justice, peace and dignity for all Africans everywhere. The Movement provides a space for progressive African civil society leaders and groups engaged in various civic struggles to convene, connect, collaborate, share knowledge and build solidarity among people and across issues. Africans Rising promotes citizens' organizing and enables civic movements in their work for social justice.



About African Liberation Day (May 25) History



African Liberation Week is an annual commemoration of the creation of the Organisation of African Unity on May 25, 1963. The day is recognized to promote unity and solidarity among African people and states. It is also the anniversary of the launch of Africans Rising on May 25, 2017.

The first-ever mobilisation took place on May 25, 2017, when two thousand volunteers, partners, supporters and friends organised a total of 300 actions & events in 42 countries on the African continent and the Diaspora, to mark the launch of the Africans Rising Movement.

In the past years, Africans Rising movement and its members have used the week of African Liberation Day (May 25) to recognize issues of illicit financial flows, slavery, and health. From 2023, the mobilisation has been focused on amplifying the Borderless Africa campaign while pushing other agendas on Climate, Economic, Energy and International crises that affect the continent.

Borderless Africa, a free movement campaign is a product of the All-African Movements Assembly (AAMA) held from 29-31 August, 2022, in Arusha, Tanzania. The goal of the campaign is to achieve an Africa where Africans can move around their own continent without the current restrictions in place.



African Liberation Week 2025

Theme & Sub-themes

The 2025 African Liberation week will be celebrated under the broad theme **“A Borderless Africa for All Africans”**. This year’s mobilisation is a continuation of the vision of an Africa where Africans can move around their continent without the current restrictions in place, for better trade, integration and development. Africans Rising’s members will also organise activities on 4 important Sub-themes

● **Pan-African Solidarity with African Countries Affected by Conflicts**

● **Economic Justice**

● **Climate and Environmental Justice**

● **Gender Justice**

African Liberation Week will be observed from 19th to 25th May 2025.

How can you take action during African Liberation Week?

There are many ways to participate in the Africans Rising African Liberation Week mobilisation. Any activity or event that celebrates, commemorates, honours, reflects on or convenes around issues of Africa and African liberation can become part of this global day of Pan-African unity. As a movement, Africans Rising is here to connect the work of grassroots activists and organisations. That is why we are encouraging anyone who is interested in planning their own event, however, may be fit. Our movement is here to amplify your voices, your work and your efforts to bring positive change to your communities.

Discussion/convening

Organise a discussion/convening (online or in your local community) with friends, activist networks or the public to discuss issues around the main ALW theme, sub-themes and other issues relevant to Africa and African liberation



Peaceful march

Organise and rally people to join a peaceful march in your community advocating for a Borderless Africa.



Dialogue

Start a dialogue and/or research and educate your community about challenges affecting your community. Create a space for discussing the options and solutions for building a healthier community



Letters Writing

Write letters about issues affecting your community and deliver them to governments and other relevant institutions.

Artistic Expressions



Share your artistic expression online or in your community of what it means to have a healthy mind, body and soul.




Artistic Activities




Carry out research


